From the Senior Warden's Corner

Greetings to All,

The summer is passing us by and it seems impossible to me that we are already nearing fall activities. I hope each of you had summers that brought you some rest and relaxation as well as good health. St. John's has been busy on several projects. I will update you on a few of them in my monthly letter.

Our transition continues and most of our activities center on getting ready for our new pastor (whomever that may be). The search committee is very active. They continue to accept names of potential candidates and are engaged in the interviewing process. Please keep them in your prayers as their efforts are ongoing and time consuming. I have been kept informed of their progress and I am very pleased to report that they are enthusiastic and very committed to the challenge and responsibility of selecting our next priest.

Another aspect of our transition is facility improvement. We have had a couple of work days and some of our parishioners have been able to help out. We have done grounds clean-up and weeding at the rectory and around the parish hall. We are in the midst of a major renovation of the rectory. The building is over 100 years old and is in excellent shape but was in need of a facelift. With that in mind St. John's Next Step Committee determined that we would seek bids for remodeling and have found a contractor who is "very excited" about working for us. Dave Feithen was hired to oversee the renovation project. He is proprietor of his own business Complete Flooring Inc. He comes highly recommended and is highly rated by the Chicagoland Better Business Bureau. He is working closely with our committee and leadership. And just in case you recognize the name Feithen, he is Donna's husband (church secretary).

The scope of work in this project is considerable. The floors and woodwork in the entire house will be sanded and refinished. All walls and ceilings will be painted. The kitchen is being renovated with new cabinets, counter tops, floor, and new appliances. The windows

are also being refinished. The back porch is being painted. And other small repairs will be completed on the house as part of this project.

We have been helping with this project in the following ways: 1) we have removed the furnishings to make work easier, 2) we have removed cabinets and improved the wiring for the kitchen, 3) all old wall paper was removed from the kitchen, bathroom, and pantry, 4) and we worked closely with the cabinet person at Lowes in designing the kitchen, etc. We hope to use the old cabinets for storage in the Atrium (church school building).

We hope this project is pretty much completed by the time Pastor Terri returns the week after Labor Day. We intend to have some type of open house after Sunday services when the project is done. So watch for details.

Other projects that are planned include improving the office space in the parish hall. We will soon complete the sacristy project. The window frame has arrived and we are looking forward to putting the final touches on this project. After the window is installed the walls will be painted. It is always rewarding when a project is done. We have many more facility improvements to consider in the months to come. You will be kept informed. As we continue our efforts to make St. John's the best place it can be please consider helping out. We can always use more helping hands. Contact Allan Luzbetak anytime to volunteer.

As I close this month's letter let me extend my sincere gratitude to all our "worker bees" who have been active throughout the summer months. You have done a great job and we appreciate it! (*continued on page 2*)

Search Committee Update as of Aug 15, 2011

Your search committee has been very active for the last two months. The Diocese has supplied us with a total of seven possible candidates for the pastor position at St John's. The committee has completed interviews for three of the candidates and will be interviewing the remaining four in August. References for all candidates are checked by the committee and then a background check will also be done by the Diocese.

The candidates have a wide variety of backgrounds and come from at least six states. The committee hopes to complete the interviews and background checks by the end of September. As soon as the committee feels we have found the right individual with the skill sets necessary to become the next pastor of St. John's, we will present the candidate to the vestry for final approval.

This is a long and organized process and the committee members are grateful for the prayers, support and trust the congregation has given us during this search for our next pastor.

- **Church School resumes** beginning with the 9:15 AM Children's Service followed by Church School. An Ice Cream Social will take the place of coffee hour after the 10:30 Service.

Vestry News

At the June 15, 2011 meeting, the Vestry...

Accepted the committee reports presented to the vestry.

Heard...

- o That finances show a positive net income.
- o Bills should be placed in the bills drawer on top of the safe rather than the treasurer's mailbox.
- o That we do not have to pay the diocese for the used portion of the new building grant, however, we cannot transfer it to capital improvements but must apply for new grants.
- o That the building projects committee discussed many projects but preparing the rectory for the new pastor is top priority.
- o That the sacristy project is nearing completion.
- o From Doug Tierney, chair of the search committee.

Took action to...

Accept a donation from Drs. William and Sandra Renner to transfer their building fund donation to support the renovation of the sacristy.

At the August 17, 2011 meeting, the Vestry...

Accepted the committee reports presented to the vestry.

Heard...

- o That a positive cash flow is influenced by lower general operating expenses and unrealized gain from investments.
- o That the audit of 2010 has begun.
- o That a renovation of the rectory is under way.
- o That the finance committee will be reconstructing donations made by individuals prior to 2010 and recorded in a program no longer used for financial records.
- o The finance committee determined that 33% of the new building funds were individual designated donations and 67% were from a trust and were undesignated.
- o That the finance committee will review the investment policies.
- o A search committee update.
- o That there will be no church picnic but an ice cream social will be planned for the opening of church school.

Took action to...

- o Recognize Pastor Terri for her efforts during the interim period with a 5% increase in stipend for her second year of service and full stipend for the portion of the month of August not covered by earned vacation or continuing education time.
- o Use an additional \$6500 from the contingency fund for capital improvements on the rectory. Approve the recommendation of the finance committee to allocate funds in the New Building and Restoration Account as indicated in their analysis (33% to the New Building Fund and 67% to the Capital Improvement Fund).

The next regular meeting is September 14, 2011 beginning at 7:00.

New landscaping with numerous plants and shrubs has been added to help make our church even more inviting. With this new frame around our church building, our church has an even more vital look. A special thanks to Karen and Cary! It looks fabulous!

On a similar note ... thank you to two of the phantom weed killers! Winston Corbett and Jerry Jezuit have been seen on occasion applying their secret potions to keep our weeds under control. Thanks and keep up the good work!

Again, these are other examples of participating and making contributions to the life of St. John's. There are many ways to get involved.

Outreach Ministry and Lockport Food Pantry

St. John's Outreach Ministry was in full swing during the summer. Our summer kicked off with a food drive supporting the Lockport Fish Pantry. We collected 172 cans and 121 boxes of food along with cash donations exceeding \$1300. We continue to support the Food Pantry with weekly donations. Remember every Sunday is Fish Sunday!

In July we participated in Morning Star Mission's Jump on the Bus program which provides everything from pencils to shoes to children in need. We supplied school clothes and supplies for 15 children. We made a difference in the life of 15 children by sending them back to school fully prepared.

In June, 2011 the Fish Pantry served 1,140 people versus 780 people in June, 2010 which is a 32% increase in just one year. They currently have the largest client base in their 30 year history.

The Fish Pantry purchases food from a central food bank where they get more value for the buck. A box of macaroni and cheese may cost us \$.80 while the Fish Pantry can purchase 3 boxes of mac and cheese for \$.80. In addition they purchase bread and meat weekly. Cash donations are needed. There are a few ways to donate funds:

Place cash in an envelope marked "Lockport Fish Pantry" and place it in the collection basket on Sunday morning

Write a check payable to St. Johns and put it in an envelope marked "Lockport Fish Pantry" and place it in the collection basket on Sunday morning

A small amount of money from many people will make a difference in helping others. All donated money is used strictly for the purpose of purchasing food. The Fish Pantry has no paid employees all work is done by 25 volunteers.

Diet food for diabetics - sugar free and low sodium

STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

Generally, monthly income exceeded expenses resulting in a positive monthly cash flow of Three Thousand Four Hundred Forty One and 78/100 Dollars (\$3,441.78). Monthly payables were met on time. Pledge income was just over budget at 107.1.4% or \$647.08 over projected income.

General Plate Income was under budget at 80.3% or \$288.66 below anticipated.

The positive cash flow was mostly influenced by lower general operating expenses for the period.

BALANCE SHEET

Balance sheet totals indicate a positive 0.4% change from the previous month. Total Liabilities & Equity are Eight Hundred Twenty Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety One and 99/100 Dollars (\$828,791.99).

STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

Generally, the two month income exceeded expenses resulting in a positive monthly cash flow of Three Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Seven and 04/100 Dollars (\$2,267.04). Monthly payables were met on time. Pledge income was over budget at 114.4% or \$2,622.88 over projected income.

General Plate Income was significantly under budget at 51.3% or \$1,428.32 below anticipated.

The positive cash flow was mostly influenced by lower general operating expenses for the period and recorded unrealized gains from investments.

BALANCE SHEET

Balance sheet totals indicate a positive 0.3% change from the previous reporting period of May, 2011. Total Liabilities & Equity are Eight Hundred Thirty Two Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Six and 64/100 Dollars (\$832,656.64).

Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual For The First Six Months of 2011

Net income for the period expenses exceeded income resulting in a negative half year cash flow of Six Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Eight and 84/100 (\$6,258.84). Capital improvements, specifically the renovations of the Sacristy contributed mostly to the negative cash flows.

Notably, pledge income is right at budget at 101.4% of anticipated, YTD \$64,565.32 has been collected. Plate offering overall are down slightly at 87.6% of anticipated, YTD \$8,992.96 has been collected.
